RECOMMENDED TIPS TO **AVOID AVIAN INFLUENZA**

Limit ACCESS to your farm to essential visitors only.





- Wash hands before and after working with poultry
- All equipment inside barns needs to be cleaned prior to use, including equipment that will be used in multiple barns.
- Change footwear and outer clothing before entering poultry barns

Avoid gathering areas of migratory birds:

- Field crops
- Any standing body of water
- Implement biosecurity measures if you must access these areas.

Implement preventative measures to avoid contamination of wild feces with your poultry flocks. feed & water resources











 Move birds inside and keep indoors through out the mirgration season



Keep record of all visitors on farm and have them sign your vistor logbook



Know what to look for, and if you spot the signs of Avian Influenza, contact your veterinarian.



SIGNS OF AVIAN INFLUENZA

Poultry who are infected may show one or more of the following symptoms:

- Coughing, sneezing or gasping for air
- Lack of appetite or energy
- Lack of coordination or nervous signs
- Diarrhea
- Decrease in egg production
- Swelling around the eyes, neck or head
- Unexpected increase in mortality and sudden death
